David Lamb is from Havelock, North Carolina. He served in the U.S. Marine Corps (2011-2015) as a Crewchief on the CH-53E Super Stallion. In 2013, he suffered from a leg and back injury and was unable to fully recover. After 4.5 years of active duty, he was medically separated (honorably) from his military duties.

David grew up a fan of Florida State University, and he and his wife Kristina moved to Tallahassee with the hopes of using the G.I. Bill to attend FSU. His plan to pursue that dream was realized through the TCC2FSU program.

In pursuing his Sport Management degree at TCC, David found an unexpected career in athletics broadcasting. Alongside TCC Athletic Director Rob Chaney, Lindsay Garinger, and play-by-play announcer Luke Fay, David worked to design a broadcast system that was worthy of representing the College. With the design of onscreen scoreboards, commercial breaks, and in-play advertising, David aided in bringing additional revenue to the athletics program. He configured the technology to be modern and efficient—writing manuals to help future volunteers operate the system.

David's groundwork allowed TCC to broadcast games during the pandemic when fans were not able to attend events. His work also allowed family and friends to watch TCC athletes play while maintaining a safe distance.

It was through the leadership, teamwork, and friendship that David learned how to successfully transition out of the military, be successful in his professional life, and discover his future career path. His TCC experience prepared him for full-time employment at FSU, and in 2020, he became the Assistant Video Coordinator for Football & Olympic Sports with FSU Athletics.
