President's Circle Funds TCC's First Undergraduate Symposium

The First Annual Undergraduate Research Symposium was funded by the TCC Foundation's President's Circle through the 2018-2019 College Innovation Grant Fund. The goal of the Symposium was to provide students with an opportunity to participate in and present original research early in their college careers.

Studies show that undergraduate research has a positive impact on the retention, timely graduation and graduate school placement of first-generation, low-income, college students (*Ishiyama, 2001*). Our hope is to improve student success rates by getting students involved in undergraduate research in their first two years of college.

This was the first time that TCC students displayed their research on such a large scale in a myriad of formats including: papers, oral presentations, performing or visual arts, film presentations, and posters. Awards and scholarships were presented in each category.

The remarkable efforts and capabilities put forth by the students would not be possible without the guiding hands of our faculty. Quality research is a result of the distinct student and faculty partnership. TCC faculty brought experience, wisdom, knowledge within their discipline. Students brought their intellectual curiosity and their enduring optimism. The goal is that this event will be a springboard for many of the students to go on to more advanced research as they progress in their academic careers.

The TCC Undergraduate Research Council set as a first-year goal to have a minimum of twenty student participants. Seventy-one abstracts were submitted.

Strengthening our Local Work Force through Scholarships

Financial need is the single greatest barrier for obtaining a postsecondary education. Scholarships are the key. They make education attainable for those who need financial assistance, and enable students to focus on their education. School to Work scholarships accomplish this goal while also strengthening our local workforce.

School to Work Scholarships provide a promise to a student to pay for tuition/books, and provide a job once that student has completed their program of study. Our area's two largest hospitals have created this kind of partnership with TCC. It began with Tallahassee Memorial HealthCare (TMH).

TMH created an endowed scholarship fund at TCC in the late 1990s. The goal was to create a pipeline to strengthen their workforce using TCC as the catalyst. This fund now totals over \$1.1M and continues to provide a strong pipeline of healthcare professionals to TMH.

“The TMH Scholarship connects TCC Health Care program students enrolled in a variety of allied health programs with funding for their education and an employment offer upon graduation. It provides a mutual benefit, assisting promising students with funding for education while at the same time providing TMH with a predictable source for much-needed talent. This scholarship is unique in that funding is usually provided for the duration of a student's education. Additionally, many students complete some, if not all, of their clinical hours at TMH, allowing them to experience our organization's culture and mission firsthand prior to employment. We are delighted to participate in this program

providing rewards to deserving students, the organization and ultimately the community.”

Capital Regional Medical Center (CRMC) created their own fund in 2016 with the goal of increasing their nursing staff. “TCC's nursing program is ranked number 7 in Florida. We love having their nurses in our network caring for our patients and wanted to grow this partnership. The CRMC School to Work Scholarship was created and each participating student receives full tuition and we receive a well-trained employee upon their graduation. This is a win for TCC, for CRMC and for our community,”

Grants

Grants provide funding for programs that would likely not exist otherwise. The Foundation is often called upon to provide required matching funding as part of a grant application; making the work of the Foundation that much more important.

SOME OF THE GRANTS AWARDED TO TCC THIS YEAR:

Eagles Connection Grant \$300,000

Provides support for the Eagle Connections program which follows the mission of the College with a focused audience of students with intellectual disabilities. Funding will allow for two full time positions to support the program as well as professional development opportunities for staff.

The Florida College System Health and Dental Outreach for Florida KidCare Grant \$15,000

Offers, promotes, and assists students and community members with signing up for Florida Kidcare, through our dental and health care programs.

Welding Technologies Laboratory Grant \$1,250,000

Supports the development of a Welding Technologies Laboratory at the Kim B. Williams Advanced Manufacturing Training Center. The project will provide a "hands on lab" for students enrolled in Career and Technical Certificate Welding Technology and Advanced Welding Technology programs. It will also provide short-term programs for industry employers and their associated incumbent workers to upgrade their technical skills.
